RESPIRATORY

Dr. Stephan Carey

October 19, 2016

Dr. Stephan A. Carey is an assistant professor of small animal internal medicine in the College of Veterinary Medicine, and an investigator with the Center for Integrative Toxicology and Pathology, both at Michigan State University. Dr. Carey completed his undergraduate training in Biological Anthropology at Duke University, and obtained his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He completed a Small Animal Rotating Internship and Residency in Small Animal Internal Medicine, both at Michigan State University. After his clinical training, he obtained his PhD in Comparative Medicine and Integrative Toxicology, also from Michigan State University. Dr. Carey is the President of the Veterinary Comparative Respiratory Society, and is an ad hoc reviewer for the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine, The Veterinary Journal, The Canadian Veterinary Journal, Tox Path, and The American Journal of Physiology. His clinical interests include canine and feline upper and lower airway disease, infectious respiratory disease, and evaluation of the role of environmental exposures on companion animal airways. His research interests are directed toward the investigation of comparative lung and nasal structure and development, and on the effects of environmental exposures on the developing respiratory system of children and pets. His research group has published numerous peer-reviewed scientific journal articles, book chapters, and proceedings.

Some of the topics to be discussed include: Canine Chronic Bronchial Disease. Feline Chronic Nasal Disease and Canine Infectious Respiratory Disease Complex.

SURGICAL EMERGENCIES

Dr. Steve Mehler

Dr. Steve Mehler received his DVM degree from the Michigan State University College of Veterinary Medicine in 2002, graduating with honors. He completed an internship in Small Animal Medicine and Surgery, as well as his residency in Small Animal Surgery at the Veterinary Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, PA. He spent the following three years as a part of the faculty at Michigan State University and split his time between soft tissue surgery and interventional radiology. Dr. Mehler has published many scientific articles and in numerous textbooks on surgical diseases of cats, dogs and exotic species. His research and clinical interests include minimally invasive surgery and the role of nutrition in inflammation. Dr. Mehler is currently a staff surgeon at Hope Veterinary Specialists and is the Chief Medical Officer of Veterinarian Recommended Nutriceuticals.

Some of the topics that will be discussed include: Penetrating Trauma-What lies Beneath with an emphasis on Thoracic Trauma-To cut or to punt. Gastrointestinal Surgical Emergencies-the blood and guts of blood and guts with an update on gastropexy techniques. Open Wound Management-combining modern techniques with ancient methods, then discuss tension relieving techniques for wound closure, followed by basic principles of drain placement. Hemostasis in Surgery-all bleeding stops, eventually.

INTERNAL MEDICINE

Dr. Michael Willard

Dr. Willard is a 1975 graduate of the Texas A&M University, College of Veterinary Medicine. He did his internship and Masters degree at Kansas State University and his internal medicine residency at Michigan State University. After that, Dr. Willard held faculty appointments at Michigan State University, Mississippi State University, and now at Texas A&M University. He has also consulted and worked at a private referral practice. He is currently a professor of Small Animal Clinical Science and specializes in gastroenterology, hepatology, pancreatology and endoscopy (flexible and rigid). Dr. Willard has given over 3,000 hours of post-graduate continuing education lectures (nationally and internationally), has over 80 refereed publications, and has over 130 book chapters in print. He has worked extensively on sled dogs as well as with the World Small Animal Veterinary Association GI biopsy workgroup. He is currently an Associate editor for the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine.

Some of the topics that will be discussed include: The title of the presentation will be, "GI/hepatic diseases: the bad, the worse, and the badest". It will be a series of case analysis on various GI and hepatic diseases.

CARDIOLOGY

Dr. Matt Miller

Dr. Miller received his DVM degree from The Ohio State University in 1984 and his Masters of Science degree from the same university in 1993. He completed a small animal medicine and surgery internship at the West Los Angeles Veterinary Medical Group from 1984-1985 and a cardiology residency at the Ohio State University from 1985-1988. He became a diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (Cardiology) in 1988. He is currently a Senior Professor of Cardiology in The Department of Small Animal Veterinary Clinical Sciences in the College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences, Texas A&M University. He is a Charter Fellow of the Michael E. DeBakey Institute of Comparative Cardiovascular Science and Biomedical Devices. He is the director of the Cardiology Service at VETMED consultants in Phoenix Arizona.

Some of the topics that will be discussed include: Feline Myocardial Disease: Thick hearts thin hearts and clots. Valvular Heart Disease: Little dogs, bigger and bigger hearts. Pericardial Disease: Diagnosis and Therapy. Canine Myocardial disease: Now we are talking big dogs Canine and Feline Heartworm Disease.

URINARY DISEASE

Dr. Joe Bartges

Dr. Bartges is a 1987 graduate of the University of Georgia and completed an internship and residencies in internal medicine and nutrition and a PhD from the University of Minnesota. He is board certified in the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and the American College of Veterinary Nutrition. He has published over 350 manuscripts, research abstracts, review articles, and book chapters, is editor of Nephrology and Urology of Small Animals and has spoken at over 200 meetings. He is on the editorial board of 5 journals including serving as an Associate Editor of the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine.

Some of the topics that will be discussed include: Urine trouble: Chronic kidney disease. Urine, a losing situation: Proteinuria and urinary tract infections. Urine pain: Urolithiasis. Urine a mess: disorders of micturition and feline lower urinary tract disease.
