STUDENT LOAN DEBT REDUCTION AWARDS

SEMVMA has a long history as a successful veterinary organization in an educational, social and community support perspective. We are proud to have implemented an additional way to continue doing this. We all know that the cost of a veterinary education has grown tremendously. The Student Debt Reduction Award was developed and instituted by SEMVMA to support members who have recently graduated. There will be two awards yearly in the amount of \$5000 to help offset some of their educational debt.

The application will be each fall with two awards presented at the Membership Celebration Dinner the following January. The selection process will be accomplished by random in the presence of a quorum of the SEMVMA Board. Applicants must be members of SEMVMA, work in our nine counties and have a current student debt obligation. They must have graduated within the 3 previous years and not have previously received the award.

Service Dog Laws and Etiquette

If you haven't already, you will likely encounter a service dog in public. From guiding someone who is blind to alerting someone who is deaf to supporting a veteran who has PTSD and more, what these dogs do is amazing.

Because of the important work that service dogs accomplish each day, they are covered under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The law allows that people with disabilities may bring their service animals to all "public accommodations" such as hotels, restaurants, stores, museums and more. This includes all types of transportation services.

Under the ADA, service animals are defined as a dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability. They are not to be confused with emotional support animals, therapy animals or companion animals.

How you act when you meet someone working with a service dog, such as a Leader Dog guiding a person who is blind, is very important. Here are some simple rules to follow to ensure the safety of the person/Leader Dog team.

- 1. Do not pet a Leader Dog in harness or take hold of the dog or its harness.
- 2. Ask the handler's permission before touching the dog or making eye contact. Eye contact can distract the dog, so always interact with the person—not the animal.
- 3. Approach the person on their right side, as the Leader Dog is usually on the left.
- 4. Never offer food to the dog. Food and treats should only be provided by the dogs' handler.

Service dogs provide independence, self-reliance, safety and more to thousands of people in the U.S. It is important to respect the role that service dogs play in their handlers lives. Service dog handlers realize that their dogs create unique social situations; however, there is more to these people than just their dog. Take the time to get to know them.

NEWSLETTER ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

In order to preserve the educational and informative purpose of the SEMVMA newsletter, the SEMVMA council adopts the following policy regarding advertising. Ads should be submitted to Barb at adminsemvma@semvma.com

Practices or businesses with a common owner shall be treated as one business or practice for the purpose of this policy (referred to as "Common Owner Business or Practice"). A common owner is a person or entity which owns 5% or more of an entity or practice. Shareholders or sole proprietors of an entity or practice shall be considered an owner along with the entity that holds an interest in the business or practice.

Corporate ¼ page ads are limited to one business, owner or corporation for each issue of the SEMVMA newsletter. This is in the interest of having the newsletter inform the association and not overwhelm them with ads. The SEMVMA council may modify or waive the application of this policy on a case by case basis at the discretion of the council.

Ads will run only once unless a request is submitted to the Administrative Secretary to run longer. Classified ads are \$15 for 60 words or less and \$25 for 61–100 words. Corporate ½ page ads are \$135 per issue or \$500 for four issues. Payment is due at the time of the initial ad placement.

SEMVMA Members interested in providing Relief Veterinary Services can advertise in the newsletter at no charge. The classified ads must follow the same guidelines regarding number of words and deadline restrictions as all other classified ads.
