



Dr. Victoria Lukasik

Dr. Victoria Lukasik is a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesia and Analgesia and a graduate of the Washington State University College of Veterinary Medicine. She completed her residency training in veterinary anesthesiology at Cornell University. In addition to time spent in her private anesthesia practice, she is also a faculty member at the University Of Arizona College Of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Lukasik has published numerous professional articles and has contributed to textbooks on the field of anesthesia. She is a nationally and internationally recognized speaker and has been presented with several professional awards, including one for compassion.

Some of the topics to be discussed include: Monitoring Breathing - If you cannot breathe, nothing else matters. This section will discuss monitoring the adequacy of breathing and the most appropriate interventions when patients are not breathing appropriately. Several case examples will be included. Monitoring the Electrocardiogram - One of the most stressful tasks of patient monitoring is recognizing arrhythmias and determining what part of the cardiac electric cycle is disrupted. This section will concentrate understanding the cardiac electric cycle and common arrhythmias seen during general anesthesia. Several case based examples will be included.

In 2021, she served as the Chair of the AAHA Task Force for the Nutrition and Weight Management Guidelines. She is also the co-editor of the textbook "Obesity in the Dog and Cat." In her spare time, she enjoys running with her English pointer, Dave. She also shares her home with her husband and two orange cats, Jake and Charles.

Some of the topics Dr. Cline will discuss include: Facts, myths, and misconceptions about pet nutrition.
