World Association of Veterinary Dermatology has gifts for you!

As private practitioners, how can we keep up with the ever-expanding body of scientific knowledge in our field? How can we remain competitive in different specialty areas? Where can we turn for accurate, concise and problem-specific information?

The World Association of Veterinary Dermatology is strongly committed to advancing the field of veterinary dermatology and allergy, to empowering practitioners at all levels in their pursuit of high-quality care. To this end, they have created 3 sources of cutting-edge, relevant and succinct information which are available to all veterinarians without cost. They are available indefinitely on the **WAVD website (http://wavd. org)**.

First, there are five articles of Consensus Guidelines.

For each of them, a team of veterinary specialists with high-quality and advanced knowledge in that field have searched the literature for articles related to that topic. The articles were reviewed for quality and relevance, as well as type of study and number of patients. From this mountain of information was created a structured article presenting the very useful information in a guidelines format. Consensus Guidelines presently available on the WAVD website include:

- Recommendation for approaches to methicillin-resistant staphylococcal infections of small animals: diagnosis, therapeutic considerations and preventative measures
- Diagnosis and treatment of dermatophytosis in dogs and cats
- Diagnosis and treatment of demodicosis in dogs and cats
- Biology, diagnosis and treatment of Malassezia dermatitis in dogs and cats
- Equine allergic skin disease

Second, Guideline Summaries.

The consensus guidelines are in-depth and expansive. Therefore, Guideline Summaries were also published. The core clinical information was trimmed down to 2-3 typed pages of the most necessary and relevant data. Guideline summaries presently available on the WAVD website include:

- Demodicosis
- Dermatophytosis
- Approaches to Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcal Infections
- Biology Diagnosis and Treatment of Malassezia Dermatitis

Third, instructional webinars are available.

Level 1 webinars are tailored to practitioners and senior veterinary students who wish to confirm/ advance their clinical skills in dermatology. There are also Level 2 topics available, which present more advanced or specialized material.

Each webinar is approximately one hour long, and presented by an experienced, recognized and respected leader in that aspect of veterinary dermatology. Each topic is clinically relevant for practitioners from entry level to experienced. Level 1 topics presently available on the WAVD website include:

In order to preserve the educational and informative purpose of the SEMVMA newsletter, the SEMVMA council adopts the following policy regarding advertising. Ads should be submitted to Barb at adminsemvma@semvma.com

Practices or businesses with a common owner shall be treated as one business or practice for the purpose of this policy (referred to as "Common Owner Business or Practice"). A common owner is a person or entity which owns 5% or more of an entity or practice. Shareholders or sole proprietors of an entity or practice shall be considered an owner along with the entity that holds an interest in the business or practice.

Corporate ¼ page ads are limited to one business, owner or corporation for each issue of the SEMVMA newsletter. This is in the interest of having the newsletter inform the association and not overwhelm them with ads. The SEMVMA council may modify or waive the application of this policy on a case by case basis at the discretion of the council.

Ads will run only once unless a request is submitted to the Administrative Secretary to run longer. Classified ads are \$15 for 60 words or less and \$25 for 61–100 words. Corporate ¼ page ads are \$135 per issue or \$500 for four issues. Payment is due at the time of the initial ad placement.

The classified ads must follow the same guidelines regarding number of words and deadline restrictions as all other classified ads.
