DERMATOLOGY

Dr. Elizabeth Layne

October 25, 2023

Dr. Elizabeth Layne is a 2002 graduate of the Colorado State University College of Veterinary Medicine. She worked in both mixed and small animal practice in her home state of Montana before pursuing dermatology specialty training in 2011 in Wisconsin. After 6 years at the UW-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine as both a trainee and an instructor, she moved to private specialty practice in Salt Lake City.

Some of the topics that Dr. Layne will discuss include:

The Dermatology TPR - Much like vital signs can give basic information before the doctor examines the pet, basic skin information can be easily and quickly obtained to steer the appointment in the right direction.

Delusion or Parasitosis - A rare psychiatric disorder in people might actually be more commonly encountered in veterinary medicine, particularly dermatology. This discussion will cover communication strategies for this challenging client scenario.

NEPHROLOGY AND UROLOGY

Dr. Larry Adams

November 15, 2023

Dr. Larry Adams is a Professor and Section Head, Small Animal Internal Medicine Veterinary Clinical Sciences, Purdue University. He became a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine, in 1991. Dr. Adams career has been focused on clinical nephrology and urology with emphasis on minimally invasive endourology procedures and hemodialysis. He adapted endourologic procedures used in humans for use in dogs including extracorporeal shock wave lithotripsy, laser lithotripsy, ureteral stent placement, and urethral stent placement.

Some of the topics that Dr. Adams will discuss include: This lecture will include information about BP measurement for awake and anesthetized patients, cystocentesis tips for success, anesthesia for urologic procedures and brief information about SUB management in cats.

EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Jess Perry, LVT, VTS-ECCM
